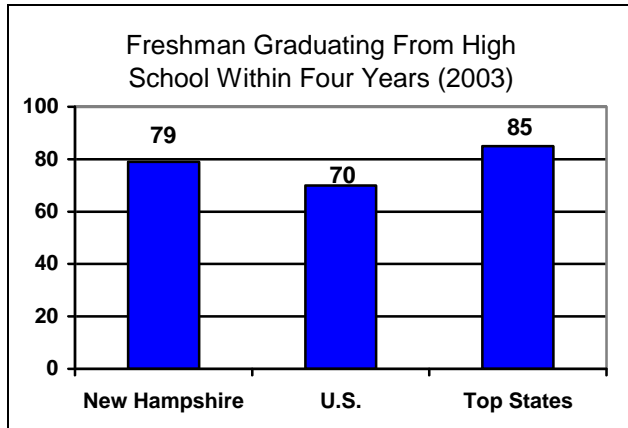




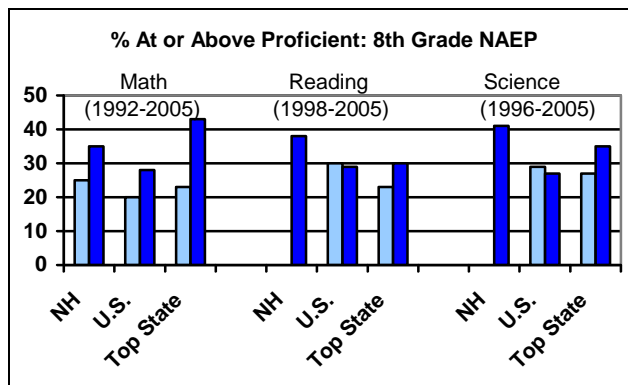
**How is New Hampshire's economy changing?**

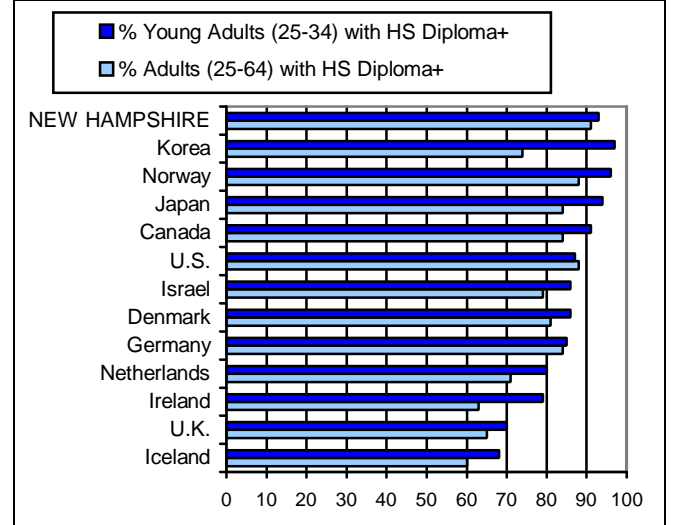
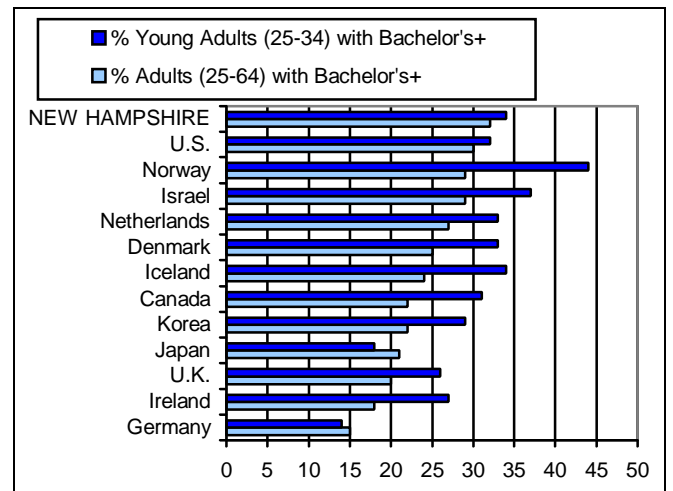
